

The National WWII Museum needs Plane Spotters!

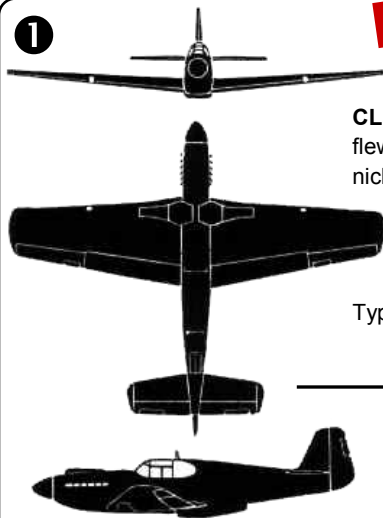

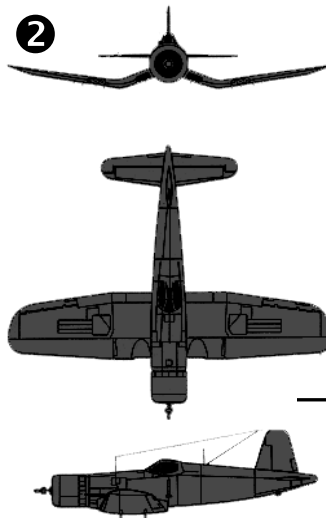

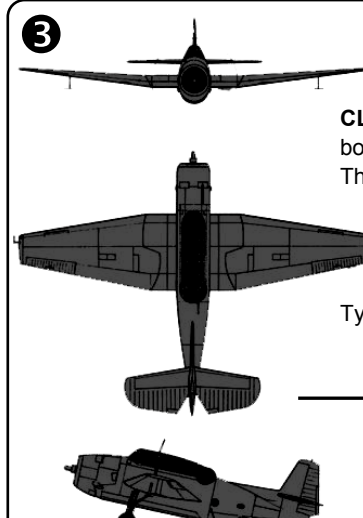

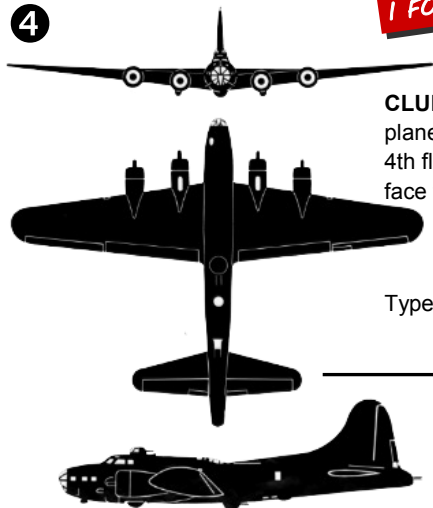

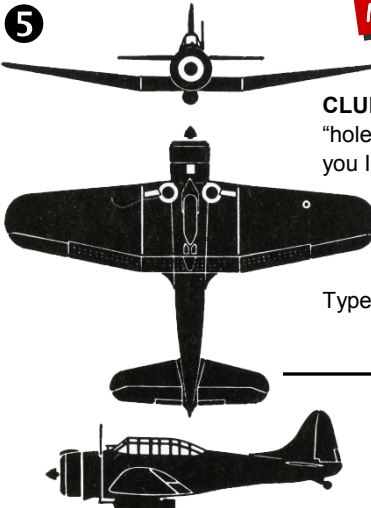

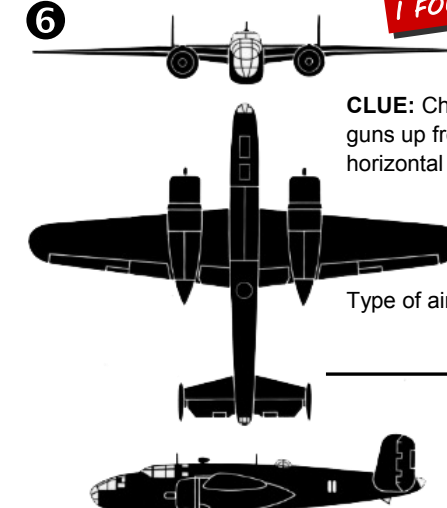

CLUE: Check out my nose guns up front and my horizontal tail fins behind.

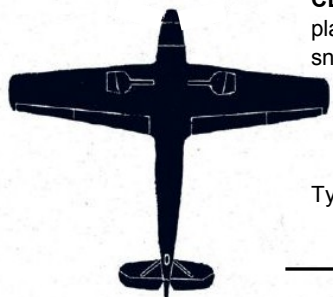

CLUE: I'm the only enemy plane here, so don't let me sneak up on you.

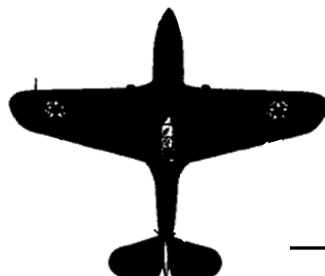

CLUE: My circular red, white, and blue emblem shows that I'm a British fighter plane.

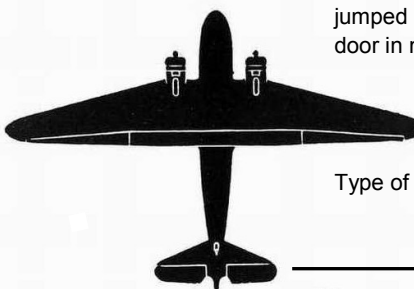

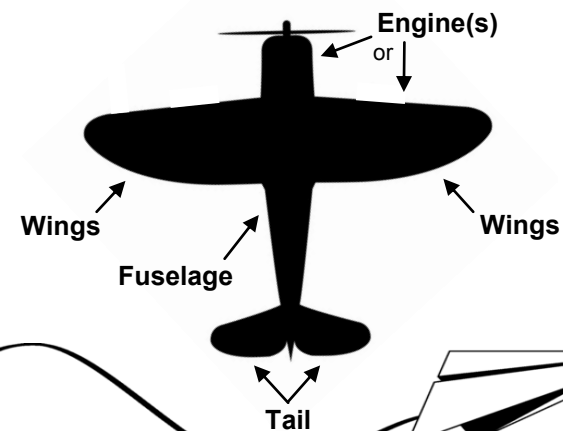
CLUE: Paratroopers jumped out of the open door in my fuselage.
